

The Programs

Middle Years Programme (MYP)

Designed for students in the 9th and 10th grades, the MYP provides a framework of learning which encourages students to become creative, critical, and reflective thinkers. The MYP encourages students to make connections between their studies in traditional subjects and the real world. It also prepares students to undertake IB 's most rigorous and well-regarded program, the Diploma Programme.

At Juárez, students will explore significant concepts in seven different subject groups that are also interconnected through six global contexts. In addition, 10th grade students will undertake a personal project, a chance to learn to manage and direct their own inquiry and further develop the skills they have learned through the MYP.

Diploma Programme (DP)

Designed for highly motivated students in the 11th and 12th grades, the DP is an academically challenging and balanced program of education with final examinations that prepares students for success at university and life beyond.

DP graduates are better prepared for college courses and are statistically more likely to attend and complete university studies than their peers. The program has gained tremendous recognition and respect from the world 's leading universities

At Juárez, students will study for two years Language and Literature, Spanish or French, History, Biology, Mathematical Studies, and Arts. In addition, all students will complete an extended essay, a Theory of Knowledge course, and will participate of a program that will enhance their creativity, action, and service skills.

Measuring Outcomes

To measure what students have learned and monitor their progress, IB teachers use a range of assessment strategies including formative assessments that provide ongoing feedback that can be used by instructors to develop their teaching and by students to identify their strengths and weaknesses, and target areas of improvement.
